(B) In Luke 22:14-23 what did Jesus do to the bread? Broke it and called it His body Lk 22:19
(C) In Luke 24:28-35 how was He recognized? By the way he broke the bread Lk 24:30-31
(D) In Mark 14:3 how did the woman get the perfume out of the container? She broke it
(E) In Isaiah 48:21 what happened to the rock that gave water? It was split
(F) In Judges 7:16-21 how were the torches gotten out of the pitchers? They were broken Jd 7:20
- (G) Perhaps we need to be broken before Christ's light within us will be seen?
- (H) In Luke 5:1-10 what happened to the nets? They started to break Lk 5:6 Could this be a symbolic foreshadowing of Peter's brokenness in Lk 5:8?

(P) In Psalm 147:1-3 who does God heal? The brokenhearted Ps 147:3
